Snapshot and Profile of Further Education and Training Provision

- \Rightarrow **23,818** participants (2019), full and part-time
- ⇒ **42** FET centres
- ⇒ Accredited programmes Leading to certification) 80%
- ⇒ Non Accredited programmes—20%

Learners with IDENTIFIED support requirements

- ⇒ Apprenticeships 34%
- ⇒ QQI levels 2 & 3 28%
- \Rightarrow QQI Levels 3 & 4 **29**
- \Rightarrow QQI Levels 5 & 6 **17%**

Profile of Learner Needs

Those Registered with Disability offices in colleges represent almost **10%** of the learner cohort

- \Rightarrow 87% of learners registering have diagnosis of need
- ⇒ Over 50% of these have Specific Learning Needs
- ♦ Dyslexia
- ♦ Significant and increasing numbers on Autistic spectrum
- ⇒ **21%** of cohort identified by staff since registering in college
- ⇒ 17% of learners presenting with Mental Health and emotional issues
- ⇒ 9% of learners with Physical disabilities
